

Best Practice 1: Examination Transparency & Continuous Assessment

Objectives

- To ensure fairness, transparency, and confidentiality in internal assessment.
- To strengthen outcome-based evaluation.
- To reduce student grievances related to evaluation.
- To promote continuous academic improvement through feedback.

Context

Higher education requires **competency-based evaluation**. Hence, College implemented a transparent and evidence-based examination mechanism.

Mechanism

- Preparation of Internal examination based on scheme for external examination.
- Preparation of marking schemes
- Evaluation of answer sheets by the subject teacher who prepares paper for reliability and validity
- Student answer sheet viewing facility and individual feedback
- Digital and physical record keeping of question papers and marks
- Moderation and result analysis meetings

Evidence of Success

- Reduction in student complaints
- Increased student confidence in evaluation
- Strong documentary evidence for authorities

Outcome Indicators

- Student satisfaction on evaluation transparency
- No moderation in answer sheets
- Reduction in examination grievances

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Best Practice 2: Organization of Blood Donation Mela on Founders' Day

Objectives:

- To promote spiritual and humanitarian values among students through active participation in blood donation.
- To inculcate gratitude and enable students and staff to pay homage to the founders of the institution.
- To integrate social service with curricular and co-curricular engagement.
- To foster unity, social responsibility, and community bonding.

Context:


The institution organizes a Blood Donation Mela on Founders' Day to promote awareness about voluntary blood donation and address the recurring shortage of blood units during emergencies. The event is designed in the spirit of a "Mela" to encourage enthusiastic participation from students and the local community while reinforcing the values of service and collective responsibility.

Practice/Implementation:

- The program begins with a ceremonial *hawan* and homage to the founders, followed by the distribution of *prasad*.
- Medical teams from the Red Cross Society of India and M.M.G. Hospital collect blood units. Donors are provided refreshments and are formally recognized during the Annual Function and Prize Distribution Ceremony.
- Various competitions related to blood donation are conducted to enhance awareness and creativity among students.
- A community Preetibhoj is organized and managed by students and volunteers, serving approximately 5,000 attendees.

Outcomes:

- Demonstrates 48 years of sustained commitment to social responsibility and community service.
- Institutionalizes a culture of humanitarian values and voluntary service on campus.
- Develops students' leadership, teamwork, and event management skills through active participation.
- Strengthens alumni engagement and promotes lifelong commitment to blood donation and social service.
- Enhances the institution's identity and reputation as a socially responsible and value-driven organization.
- Builds long-term collaborations with hospitals and recognized health organizations.


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
